The scores on this card are based on two Choice votes that occurred in the Ohio Senate during the 2005-2006 General Assembly. These votes were:

**Contraceptive Equity Amendment:** Vote to table the Contraceptive Coverage Amendment which would require health insurance plans to cover all FDA approved forms of contraception at the same rate as other prescriptions.

**Sub. H.B. 239 Abortion Funding Restrictions:** This bill took the current Ohio Department of Health rules about state funding for abortion services and codified them into the Ohio Revised Code. These rules include a prohibition on state funds, either through state employee health insurance or through state Medicaid money, being used for abortion services unless the abortion is necessary to save the woman's life or the woman was a victim of rape or incest.

In addition to their votes, co-sponsorships of reproductive rights related bills are indicated by a number following their score. A number one (1) indicates co-sponsorship of the Ohio Prevention First Act a bill NARAL Pro-Choice Ohio supported. A number two (2) indicates co-sponsorship of Sub. H.B. 239 (see above for a full description) a bill NARAL Pro-Choice Ohio opposed.
